On behalf of **The Thousand Islands Yacht Club**, our 2017/18 Bridge: Commodore, **Doug Cowburn**, dh.cowburn@gmail.com, Past Commodore **Michael Zinay**, Vice-Commodore, **Heidi Suter** and Treasurer, **Philip Mason**, treasurer@tiyc.ca; and all our Club members, we would like to extend to you and your members reciprocal privileges for 2018 as outlined below. Please note that in 2015 we extended our reciprocal privileges on a perpetual basis, this offer still stands.

The **TIYC** is a small group of cruising boaters, both sail and power, based out of **Iroquois Marine Services** whose marina and harbour are located on the St. Lawrence River midway between the 1000 Islands Bridge and Lake St. Lawrence, approximately 1/2 mile above the Iroquois Seaway Lock. It is a Canada Customs Port of Entry. Through special arrangements with the marina, the Club is able to offer mooring and docking privileges in Iroquois to members of other recognized Yacht Clubs that have extended reciprocal privileges to our members. Additionally since most of our members are to be found in and around the Thousand Islands during the summer, a place notorious for its lack of docking, we invite your members when visiting the islands to raft-up to any of our members boats flying the TIYC burgee. In Iroquois we offer the **first nights mooring free**, and thereafter at \$1.50 Cdn per foot; in the islands you may raft-up **as long as the member remains**. We are working on installing Club mooring balls at key locations throughout the Thousand Islands area. We ask that members of reciprocal clubs use their membership cards to identify themselves to the Yacht Club or Marina office when arriving or to our members when rafting-up.

To get into the Iroquois harbour, enter our 7 foot channel at Buoy 112, Chart 1434. From the Red and Green daymarks at the entrance it is approximately 0.5 nm from the channel entrance to the docks. Keep the Old Galop Canal berm about 30 feet off your port side until you come to the cut in the berm to enter the harbour area. Centre your boat in through the cut, don't "cut the corner", then, if you have not already received instructions on VHF 68, bear to starboard and tie up on the long service dock. There are buoys in the channel, when entering from the river. You are coming against the current, so keep Reds to starboard and Greens to port. The offices and facilities are at the top of the rise up from the marina area. By road, we are on County Road 2 (Old Highway 2), 1/2 mile west of the intersection of Carman Road (401 Exit #738) in Iroquois.

Iroquois is centrally located for driving trips to Ottawa, Kingston, Brockville, Cornwall and Montreal. A short drive via the Prescott/Ogdensburg Bridge allows for day visits to the United States. History buffs can explore Fort Henry in Kingston and Fort Wellington in Prescott. The renowned Upper Canada Village, the Chrysler Farm Battlefield and the Parks of the St. Lawrence are only 14 miles to the east. Prehistoric World offers a prehistoric trail filled with life-sized dinosaur statues or take time for a play at the Upper Canada Playhouse in Morrisburg.

For supplies and services, the Village of Iroquois offers many amenities: a grocery store, pharmacy, LCBO store (wine, spirits and beer), Royal Bank, Bank of Montreal, Interac machines, medical and dental clinics and an airstrip. For a leisurely time, Iroquois offers an Iroquois Golf Course, beach, tennis courts, bike path, parks and an excellent viewing station of the Iroquois St. Lawrence Seaway Lock. Don't feel like going too far? We offer a spacious BBQ hut complete with gas BBQ's for your use. Enjoy the day fishing from the dock. Our boat basin flourishes with wildlife. For the boat lover, the marina yard has many on-going projects and yachts of all descriptions.

Iroquois Marine Services caters to yachtsmen, power boaters and vacationers on the St. Lawrence River. It is a full service boatyard and Marina Specializing in Winter Storage, Winterizing, seasonal and transient dockage, Hull Painting, hull, rigging and engine Maintenance & Repairs. The 30-Ton Open-End Travel Lift is always available for Hull inspections, Hauling & Launching. Although all and any work on your boat can be professionally undertaken by the Marina, boat owners are encouraged to work on their own boats once they are safely in the yards.

Other services include:

- Fuel - gas, diesel & cylinder propane, pump-out facilities
- 15A and 30A power and water on the dock
- Snacks - Ice - Drinks
- Public Telephone - designated CBSA check-in
- Marine Supplies - Oil, filters, additives, paint, varnish, solvents, epoxy, brushes, rollers, tape, cleaners, polishes, batteries, and antifreeze
- Help is always available placing and receiving custom orders
- Clean washrooms and showers
- Mast stepping hoist
- Inside and outside storage of sail, power and commercial vessels
- A full service shop with two heated bays for repairs and maintenance
- CCTV security system.
- Wi-Fi coverage of the docks.
